Provide new, effective resources and support for patients and families in crisis.



Ending Addiction Stigma Address stereotypes, prejudice and discrimination associated

Address stereotypes, prejudice and discrimination associated with substance use disorders through education and advocacy.

APF's Impact in 2024

In 2024, APF's programs reached over 2.2 million people. This achievement demonstrates APF's steadfast dedication to supporting patients and families, ending addiction stigma, enhancing prevention and early intervention efforts, bridging the gap between science and practice, and ensuring that scientific innovations and advancements in substance use disorders are accessible to the community.

APF led a focused effort to address the fentanyl crisis through public education, multilingual awareness campaigns, professional training, and policy advocacy to strengthen prevention and response strategies nationwide. APF, in partnership with the Justice Community Opioid Innovation Network (JCOIN) a program led by the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA), developed and launched a targeted e-course titled "Fentanyl Facts and Overdose Risks" for practitioners, law enforcement, public health officials, and families, helping build awareness of how synthetic opioids like fentanyl drive overdose deaths. In partnership with the Cencorra Impact Foundation, APF also released multilingual fentanyl awareness resources in 12 languages—making sciencebacked prevention materials available to families and communities globally—to educate about the risks of illicit fentanyl, fentanyl adulterants in the drug supply and counterfeit pills.

APF also advocated for the legislative response to the fentanyl crisis by mobilizing sign-on letters and supporting passage of bills like the HALT Fentanyl Act and the HIDTA Enhancement Act of 2024, advancing policy tools for fentanyl interdiction and prevention. APF also focused policy efforts on treatment resources by coordinating nationwide

advocacy efforts to support the bipartisan SUPPORT for Patients and Communities Reauthorization Act (S. 3393)

APF's anti-stigma training program,
Responding to Addiction, was piloted in
partnership with the Ohio Department of
Mental Health & Addiction Services, the
RecoveryOhio initiative, and the University of
Delaware between August 2023 and May 2024
across multiple sites. The evaluation (213
participants) found statistically significant
increases in addiction knowledge and
reductions in stigma (stereotypes, prejudice,
discrimination intent).

To advance anti-stigma efforts nationwide, we held the inaugural Anti-Stigma Institute 2024 in Washington D.C. in October 2024. This twoday training convened community leaders, healthcare professionals, and advocates focused on ending addiction-related stigma through evidence-based interventions, curriculum, and certifications in delivering such trainings locally. We also announced the expansion of its 2023-24 anti-stigma initiative sites: 117 sites across 34 U.S. states and three international locations spanning community service organizations, treatment programs, public-health offices, hospitals, and government agencies. These sites serve as "pilots" for implementing and measuring stigma reduction strategies.

In 2024, Addiction Policy Forum continued to strengthen its impact by advancing evidence-based solutions, expanding support for families, and elevating the voices of those affected by substance use disorders. Through innovative programs, strategic partnerships, and persistent advocacy, the organization helped drive meaningful progress in prevention, treatment, recovery, and public awareness.

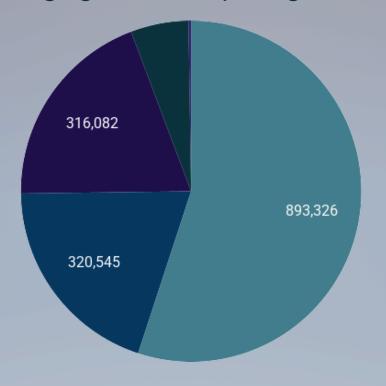

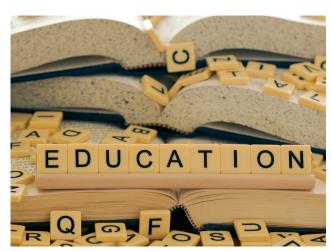
enCompass Program

enCompass: A Comprehensive Training on Navigating Addiction is an evidence-based resource for family members and caregivers trying to navigate the complex world of addiction and help loved ones achieve recovery.



Addiction School

APF's free, online school features online courses on critical topics for patients, families, and practitioners, from the risks of vaping and alcohol use disorder to courses on treatment options for addiction, from medications to behavioral therapies.



Disease Education

APF's education and awareness initiatives are designed to increase understanding of addiction as a chronic, treatable medical condition. We develop and share evidence-based resources on substance use disorders.



Awareness Campaigns

APF creates campaigns to address stigma and myths around addiction, as well as advance prevention and treatment. Our campaigns include #StopOverdose, Opioid Prevention Campaign, Stop the Stigma, Naloxone Awareness, Fentanyl Risks and Alcohol 101.

Responding to Addiction

The 2.5-hour Responding to Addiction curriculum is designed to reduce addiction stigma, increase knowledge, and confidence in how we can help someone in need for families, criminal justice professionals, faith leaders, and healthcare providers



Anti-Stigma Initiative

Addiction Policy Forum's Anti-Stigma Initiative includes over 100 pilot sites nationwide working to reduce addiction stigma, including stereotypes, prejudice, and discrimination intent.



Stop Overdose

The Stop Overdose campaign gives families and friends a national platform to share their stories of loved ones lost while also increasing public awareness of the opioid epidemic.



Stigma Research

APF's stigma research explores how language, imagery, and community perceptions impact individuals with substance use disorders, advancing evidence-based strategies to reduce discrimination and promote compassion in care and policy.

Prevention Projects



Children Impacted by Addiction

The toolkit is designed for adults who come into contact with children impacted by a parent's addiction and provides information about how to help.



Opioid Prevention Campaign

The Opioid Prevention Campaign is a public health media campaign to help prevent adolescent substance use.



Vaping: Know the Facts

A free, open-source toolkit that explains the harms associated with adolescent vaping and empowers audiences with the tools to take action.



12 Things Parents Can Do

The campaign for parents and caregivers includes a toolkit and explainer video on prevention strategies.



Multilingual Resources

APF translated resources into 12 languages in partnership with the Cencorra Impact Foundation to help improve language access to prevention materials.



Protect Your Brain

The eCourse and curriculum teach teens how to protect themselves from substance use disorders.

Bridging the Science to Practice Gap

The barriers to translating research into practice have hampered the adoption of new treatments, tests, and clinical standards for everything from flu vaccines to diabetic eye exams to cholesterol screenings. To change the trajectory of the substance use disorder public health crisis, APF works to improve the gap between science and its application in the field.



Knowledge Translation

APF translates and disseminates research findings into easy-to-consume and persuasive formats tailored for distinct audiences, including policymakers, practitioners, caregivers, and the general public. The APF team excels at translating scientific information into consumable, accessible, and actionable products that are tailored for various non-scientific audiences. Our translation process turns complex research into easy-to-comprehend formats for diverse audiences.



Stakeholder Engagement

Stakeholder engagement is fundamental for understanding diverse perspectives, gathering insights, and fostering collaboration to achieve mutually beneficial outcomes, and involving individuals, groups, or organizations that have an interest or are affected by a particular project, decision, or initiative. Being open to feedback and adapting plans or strategies based on stakeholder input. Responsiveness to concerns or changing circumstances is crucial for maintaining stakeholder engagement.



Dissemination

The APF team excels at translating scientific information into consumable, accessible, and actionable products that are tailored for non-scientific audiences. The tested translation process turns complex research into easy-to-comprehend formats for diverse audiences. APF's knowledge translation and dissemination expertise can help expand the reach of your research and engage new and diverse audiences.

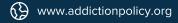
